Dear Friends of the Alliance,

The Alliance Light From Darkness

2016 was one of our most inspiring years and also one of the most challenging. There were significant losses of key individuals connected with the lecture series: first **Betty Kale**, a Holocaust survivor who spoke to hundreds of local students about her experiences, then **Evelyn "Evey" Sackler** an early and a long-term member of the Alliance Board. In June, **Lillian Judd**, a Holocaust survivor left us. Her moving story touched thousands of students including her final presentation to over 300 students and teachers at Windsor High School. Her dear friend **Sylvia G. Sucher**, a founding member of the Alliance who had encouraged and supported both Betty and Lillian in sharing their experiences in our local schools, died two weeks short of her 104th birthday. The dedication and commitment of these four remarkable women touched many of us very deeply. Betty, Lillian and Sylvia's stories will be highlighted at the upcoming community-wide Yom Hashoah Commemoration on April 30th.

We were especially gratified that Barbara Tomin and Congregation Beth Ami sponsored a performance of Corey Weinstein's play *Erased: Babi Yar, the SS, and Me* in September and encouraged donations to benefit the Alliance in loving memory of Lillian Judd, Betty Kale, and Sylvia G. Sucher. The show coincided with the 75th anniversary of the gunfire massacre in the Babi Yar ravine in Kiev, Ukraine in 1941. Many thanks to all involved including performers Tom Herz and Saralie Pennington.

2016 was also a year of growth for the Alliance with the energy and commitment of new and continuing Board members, Myrna Goodman, the Director of the Center for the Study of the Holocaust and Genocide, and Diane Parness' leadership as the Academic Coordinator of the Lecture Series. Our Alliance Education Committee benefitted from an infusion of energy and enthusiasm as many new Holocaust and genocide survivors and their descendants accepted an invitation to become active in educating students in our community about the impact of intolerance. Since this summer, we have also been working one-on-one with a number of descendants of Holocaust survivors who will be speaking to students for the first time sharing powerful stories of resilience, survival and commitment to countering intolerance.

2016 also saw a continued commitment by the Board to reach out in the community including tabling at each of the lectures in the 2016 series and at three events in April and May: two Yom Hashoah commemorations (one community-wide and one at Congregation Shomrei Torah), and the Jewish Community Center's annual cultural festival, Simcha Sunday. The attendance of members of the community and students at local schools at lectures in the annual series at Sonoma continues to exceed our expectations.

Board members were also actively involved in events marking the 101st anniversary of the Armenian Genocide and the 22nd commemoration of the genocide of Tutsis in Rwanda, *Kwibuka* 22. I was deeply moved by the invitation from Her Excellency Ambassador Mathilde Mukantabana to speak at the commemoration at the Embassy of Rwanda in Washington, D.C. on "The Consequences of Genocide Denial."

The 2016 lecture series promises to be inspiring with a number of new speakers and topics. Much gratitude goes to Pearl and David S. Furman, Myrna Goodman, Dennis Judd, Her Excellency Mathilde Mukantabana, Chiaya Rawlins, and Arline Thomas who stepped up to underwrite lectures in the upcoming series. We are also thrilled to have Hans Angress, a Holocaust survivor and Alliance Board member, deliver the first annual **Sylvia G. Sucher Memorial Lecture**.

Report from the Center for the Study of the Holocaust and Genocide

2016 was another outstanding year for the Holocaust and Genocide Studies program at Sonoma State. Our Annual Lecture Series was titled **Into the 21st Century: Genocide in our Time**. We featured wide-ranging lectures that included the Northern California premiere of *Karski and the Lords of Humanity*, a film exploring the work of Jan Karski, a courageous Polish resistance figure as well as *Hitler's Furies*, which examined the complicity of German women in the Holocaust. This coming year, on March 28th, we will once again welcome Rabbi Michael Berenbaum who will address our central theme for this year's series: **Between Memory and History**.

After several years of planning, we were finally able to coordinate the digitization of 32 years of recorded Holocaust Series' lectures. Using donations to a dedicated fund established by the Alliance at our 30th year anniversary celebration, two grants from the Jewish Community Federation, the resources of the Center and the expertise, coordination and hard work of the staff and students of SSU's Instructional Technology division, the project is close to completion. All of the Series' lectures will soon be available via a dedicated Lecture Series *YouTube* Channel. The archive has also been preserved digitally. Our sincere thanks to the members of the Alliance for raising funds to facilitate this project and especially to Barbara Lesch McCaffry who worked with the staff in the Federation and wrote the grants.

We lost two of our most important and beloved advocates this past year. Sylvia G. Sucher z''l (of blessed memory), a founding member of the Alliance and a strong advocate of our work, and Lillian Judd, a Holocaust survivor who tirelessly devoted herself to educating students all over Northern California. Board member Arline Thomas and I have underwritten James Waller's April 4th lecture, *Becoming Evil*, in Lillian's memory. We hope to see many of you there.

As they have for several years, Henry & Lucille Libicki and Robert & Murray Zucker made generous donations to the Center through their Jewish Community Federation Endowments. My deepest thanks for their consistent support. Thanks, as well to Viri Ruiz, our administrative assistant, for her support this past year. In addition to helping maintain our website and attending to our organizational needs, Viri coordinated our biannual office move.

Be certain to check the schedule for the 2017 Lecture Series. Professor Parness has arranged what I believe will be the most comprehensive one in our history.

Report from the Lecture Series Academic Coordinator

Our 2016 lecture series featured innovative and memorable presentations. For the past couple of years we have enjoyed remarkable films capturing the sorrow of the Armenian Genocide and last year, the life of an iconic Holocaust resistance hero, Jan Karski. Slawomir Grünberg's remarkable *Karski and the Lords of Humanity* was surely one of the highlights of our 2016 series. We are very fortunate to benefit again from the generosity of the Armenian Genocide Memorial Fund, who will support the presentation of Bared Maronian's *Women of 1915*. This will be the Bay Area premiere of what promises to be an important work. Many of you will recall Maronian's moving film *Orphans of the Genocide*, which we presented in 2015.

This year is marked by the absence of a friend to many and inspiration to all, Holocaust survivor Lillian Judd. Last year Lillian and her son Dennis supported Prof. Alex Alvarez's important presentation on Climate Change, Border Regions and the Genocide Impulse. Dennis will continue that tradition by underwriting Prof. Alvarez's lecture again next year. We are very pleased to have Dennis presenting a new film, *The Lillian Judd Story*. Arline Thomas and Myrna Goodman are underwriting one of our core presentations, Prof. Jim Waller's *Becoming Evil*, in Lillian Judd's memory. In these important ways we secure Lillian's legacy.

Other highlights of 2016 must include our first lecture on the politicide in Argentina, presented by Prof. Kerry Whigham. We were very happy to welcome back Irfan Mirza for his outstanding presentation on Bosnia. Irfan will be with us

again in 2017. For the first time we listened to Dr. Song Tan's moving account of the Cambodian Genocide. It was a pleasure to have Prof. Carol Rittner return with her insight on the subject of gender and genocide.

Next semester we are very pleased to again welcome **Prof. Michael Berenbaum** for the **Robert L. Harris Memorial Lecture**, underwritten by Pearl and David S. Furman. Prof. Berenbaum will speak on our theme for 2017, **Between Memory and History**. Other key events for next year's series will include presentations on the *American Genocide*, **The Story of the** *Stolpersteine*, **Rwanda: Memory & Recovery, The Cambodian Genocide**, and **Genocide** in **Syria**.

Every year we benefit from the support and contributions of our own faculty and friends. They are the foundation of our series, and allow us to continue the high standard of this unique lecture series. I hope you will be able to join us.

Report from the Chair of the Alliance Education Committee

In 2015, the Alliance Education Committee expanded its long-standing mission of "supporting Holocaust and Genocide education in conjunction with the Center for the Study of the Holocaust and Genocide at Sonoma State University" to include coordinating classroom presentations by Holocaust and genocide survivors and their descendants.

This past January, a letter was sent to the principals of all Sonoma County public and private middle and high schools indicating the resources available to teachers including information about attendance at the Spring 2016 lectures at Sonoma State, access to the video archives of prior lectures available through *YouTube*, as well as assistance in coordinating presentations in their classrooms. We have also been coordinating our efforts with Speaker's Bureau requests from teachers in Sonoma County to the Jewish Family and Children's Services' Holocaust Center in San Francisco.

This past year speakers from the Alliance have given one or more presentations at twelve local schools that engaged over 2,400 students and 50 teachers at:



These presentations, which also include a representative from the Alliance Education Committee, have focused on the Holocaust or the Armenian Genocide. The speakers also discuss issues related to genocide and the need for people to become "upstanders" in the face of acts of intolerance.


The Alliance Education Committee is currently working with speakers that include Holocaust survivors and their descendants, an Armenian Genocide descendant, and a witness to the Genocide against the Tutsi in Rwanda. We have been developing a number of alternative formats for presentations including panels and interviews. We hope to develop a panel of speakers that represent a range of genocides that focuses on the commonalities of those experiences and their impact.

Alliance History

The Alliance for the Study of the Holocaust was formed in 1982 on behalf of the victims and survivors of the Holocaust and the need to tell their stories and for others to learn from their experiences. Those who began this collaborative effort between the community and members of the Sonoma State University faculty promised to let the world know of the atrocities that had occurred. The initial intention was primarily to learn the facts, act on them, and never forget.

As a result of these efforts, a highly successful annual lecture series on the Holocaust and Genocide was created at Sonoma State University. As a University-community partnership, the Board includes members of the community, University faculty and administrators, and students who have participated in the Lecture Series. In 2010, the name of the Alliance was changed to the Alliance for the Study of the Holocaust and Genocide to reflect its revised mission and its continuing educational commitment to include all those affected by genocide.
